Volunteer Coaches Needed - Fairford Rugby Club needs you!

I remember being quite nervous when I first volunteered. I hadn't played rugby since secondary school and if I'm honest, I've always been a bigger football than a rugby fan. Would I remember how to play? Could I translate that into coaching? Would the kids enjoy it? What would the other parents think? In hindsight, I needn't have worried. It's amazing how quickly it all comes back and how much support there is out there. FRFC is RFU accredited. This means that as a coaching volunteer you'll have access



to a range of resources from initial concussion and safeguarding training, session plans and coaching materials, right through to full 15-a-side England Rugby Coaching qualifications. Even better, the club will cover the costs of any course you complete, make sure you are fully security checked and give you a snazzy coaches top to keep you warm and dry!

I love coaching with the Under 6's. Watching the kids go from being really uncertain at the start of the season to being confident and scoring tries at the end is really rewarding. You don't need an intimate knowledge of World Rugby Laws to build a team and help kids enjoy sport. Rugby is great to be part of with some fantastic values and an awesome community spirit – particularly in Fairford! Junior and Minis Training – what do we do?

I'll always remember my first training session with the under 6's. We had 30 or so kids, all at different levels. Some were clinging to their parents, crying because they couldn't throw or catch the weird eag-shaped ball that was being given to them and someone had taken their tag. At the other end of the scale we had a group of kids who had somehow transformed from mild mannered 4-year olds to mini Chris Ashtons, darting the full length of the pitch at pace before leaping through the air like Superman and scoring 'Ash Smash' tries. In between were a mixture of those just excited to be there and others looking generally confused. At the end of the season however, my team played Cirencester and I couldn't have been prouder of the performance that they put in.

won, but in all of them, you could see the improvement in every child. As an RFU accredited club, we follow the Age Grade Rugby guidelines: https://www.englandruaby.com/my-ruaby/players/age-grade-ruaby/. All age groups under 8 play tag rugby with most of the training sessions focussing on basic skills. From Under 9s onwards kids are introduced to the contact game where the ability to call on these basic skills becomes more important.

At every level however, we coach the core rugby values:

CORE VALUES OF RUGBY

Teamwork

- We play selflessly: working for the team, not for ourselves alone, both on and off the field.
- We take pride in our team, rely on one another and understand that each player has a part to play.

Respect

- We hold in high esteem our sport, its values and traditions and earn the respect of others by the way we behave.
- We value our coaches and those who run our clubs and treat clubhouses with consideration.

Enjoyment

- We encourage players to enjoy training and playing.
- We enjoy being part of a team and part of the rugby family because it enhances confidence and self-esteem.

Discipline

- We ensure that our sport is one of controlled physical endeavour and that we are honest and fair.
- We obey the 'Laws of the Game' which ensure an inclusive and exciting global game.

Sportsmanship

- We uphold the rugby tradition of camaraderie with team mates and opposition.
- We ensure that the wellbeing and development of individual players is central to all rugby activity.

Age groups are prescribed by the RFU to make sure that every player is able to enjoy rugby in a safe environment where they can develop their personal and social skills as well as a wide array of transferable multi-sports skills. As parents, please feel free to speak to your coaches if you have questions about these values, your children's matches or training sessions. If you have ideas and inputs, then we'd also love to hear from you.


Kit store – Online and in the Cabin
